Program Information

The Florida Department of Revenue (Department) is excited to announce the virtual offering of IAAO 601 – Cadastral Mapping Methods & Applications, from the International Association of Assessing Officers (IAAO). The virtual format will enable a diverse set of trainees to participate remotely. Trainees will have opportunities to ask questions, collaborate, share ideas and practice new skills as they would in a traditional classroom. For optimal learning, participants should clear their calendars during course and exam times and attend in a quiet space free from outside distractions.

IAAO 601 Description*

This course is a continuation of the mapping science curriculum and exposes students to aspects of protocol and legal principles that are not featured in Course 600. For more information about this course, please review the **Course Information Packet**.

Recommended prerequisites: IAAO 101 – Fundamentals of Real Property Appraisal, IAAO 600 – Principles and Techniques of Cadastral Mapping

Instruction and Testing

Trainees will receive further instructions from IAAO regarding testing. **This is a live course**, and the materials and pace will be like in-person instruction. Your instructor, Rick Norejko, is highly rated for IAAO courses and delivers a quality course.

The course will be held 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. EDT November 15-18, 2021. The instructor will provide the course schedule. The testing window is November 19-24, 2021. Trainees will attend class using Zoom, and the training link will be in the registration confirmation. Course materials will be mailed to registrants the week prior to the course. Scratch paper and pencils will also be helpful.

Technology Requirements

- A computer with a web camera and microphone is required to take the course and exam.
- A calculator is required.

Prior to the course, students are asked to download Zoom and review the Zoom information on Joining a Meeting.
