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3 PROCEEDINGS 1 2 MS. FORRESTER: Good morning. My name is 3 Janice Forrester. I am the Revenue Program Administrator for the technical assistance section 4 5 and Property Tax Oversight Program for the 6 Department of Revenue. 7 I will be the moderator for today's hearing. My role as moderator is to preside in a neutral 8 9 fashion. 10 Staff from the Department are here today to 11 receive comments on the proposed amendments. At this time, I would like staff to introduce 12 themselves by name and position title. 13 14 MS. HARPER: My name is Jenna Harper. I am 15 the Compliance Assistance Process Manager. 16 MR. KELLER: My name is Steven Keller. I am 17 one of the attorneys with the Department of Revenue. 18 19 MR. JACKSON: Anthony, Jackson, Jr., Senior 20 Tax Specialist, PTO. 21 MS. FORRESTER: Thank you. Today is October 22 27, 2020. This is a public rule hearing scheduled 23 under Section 120.54(3)(c), Florida Statutes. As deemed necessary, the Department is 24 25 holding this hearing to discuss the proposed

amendments to Rule 12D-16.002, Florida
Administrative Code and incorporated form. The
Department published a notice of proposed rule in
the September 24, 2020 edition of the Florida
Administrative Register, Volume 46, Number 187,
Pages 3,984 to 3,985.

For those at the computer, the draft rule and forms are on the Department's -- sorry, proposed rules page at http://floridarevenue.com/rules, select the "property tax rules" drop down at the bottom of the page then select "Rule 12D-16.002, Notarization."

I now will ask Anthony Jackson to explain the process that we will use for taking comments on the agenda items.

MR. JACKSON: Good morning. Ladies and gentlemen, if you are attending this hearing using your computer raise your hand using the icon on the grab-tab to the left of your control panel. We will address you when it's your turn to speak. Please, state your name and whom you represent.

If you experience difficulty use the quick-chat option to send me a message. If you are attending this hearing using the option "telephone with audio pin" and you have a question

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or comment, send an e-mail to

We will address you by name and unmute your phone when it is your turn to speak. 4 If vou 5 are using the option "telephone with no audio pin" 6 and want to ask a question or make a comment, you 7 must send an e-mail to dorpto@floridarevenue.com. Please use the subject line "October 27th 8 9 hearing." In the e-mail, add your name and whom 10 you represent. We will acknowledge your e-mail or 11 read your comment out loud.

12 All comments received during this hearing 13 will be recorded by the court reporter. Written 14 comments will be posted to the proposed rule page 15 with the transcript. Thank you.

MS. FORRESTER: All right. We will take comments on each agenda item from attendees. Again, for anyone using a computer raise your hand electronically, or e-mail us your comment, or that you wish to speak. When you do speak, please tell us your name and who you represent.

The proposed form notice for workshop published August 24th have not been amended or changed. Form VR509 was removed from the rule package for further review.

We ask that you provide only comments or suggested changes that are directly relevant to the proposed forms. Please hold all other general comments until after we have discussed the agenda items.

I'm now turning the hearing over Mr. Kellerto present the draft rule and form.

8 MR. KELLER: Good morning. Today we have 9 four proposed forms. And I'm going to go through 10 them in numerical order and talk a little bit 11 about the rule that adopts the forms at the end.

12 Essentially, what we have with these four forms is a statute that requires that the forms be 13 14 sworn to or under oath. There are, basically, four categories of these oaths and I'm going to go 15 16 through them. And our Department has been leaning towards the third category. There is a team of 17 18 people that have been looking at these forms and 19 coming up with recommendations with what you see 20 here before you -- that is the third category.

The first category is when a statute requires a form to be under oath or sworn to and then the notary public must appear, and everybody appears before the notary, and then the notary stamps the form.

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The second category is when you have a notary 1 2 that appears online and everybody is online, so we 3 have an online notary in the second category. And this is under Chapter 117, Florida Statutes --4 that was amended in 2019, extensively, to allow 5 the online notarization. And under the online 6 notarization, everyone must be able to see and 7 hear each other on the internet connection or so 8 9 forth and then the notary stamps the document 10 electronically.

11 And the third category is when something is 12 required to be done under oath it can be done by 13 signing under penalty of perjury in a statement 14 that says, "Under penalty of perjury, I certify 15 that the above is true and correct," and that 16 statute is Section 92.525 -- that is 925.25, 17 Florida Statutes.

18 And the forth category is when there is no 19 statute that requires a sworn statement or under 20 oath then the document is typically done by 21 certifying -- the taxpayer certifies that the 22 information is true and correct. And the flagship 23 statute for that is Section 196.011(1) -- that is 196.011(1), Florida Statutes. Those documents are 24 25 not under oath and they are just certified. With

that we can go to the first form, which is the
 Return of Real Property in an Attempt to Establish
 Adverse Possession Without Color of Title, Form
 DR452.

5 And I will open it up. Does anyone have 6 comments on this form? Essentially, this form 7 just adopts the "under penalty of perjury 8 statement" at the bottom. And that is actually in 9 the statues, Section 5.018 -- I'm sorry, 0 --10 95.18, Florida Statutes. And I will open it up 11 for comments on this form.

(NO RESPONSE.)

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MS. FORRESTER: Just let the record show thatno comments have been received by e-mail.

15 MR. KELLER: Okay. The second form that we 16 will talk about today is the Power of Attorney for Representation Before the Value Adjustment Board, 17 Form DR486POA. And this form has a -- it is 18 19 required to be adopted or in compliance with 20 Chapter 709, Florida Statutes and that talks about 21 the power of attorney and so on. This form is 22 being amended to allow for the online 23 notarization, as well as the physical presence notarization, so those would be alternatives to 24 25 get this form notarized. It does have in the

statute -- the powers of attorney, a requirement 1 2 that there be two witnesses and so those witnesses 3 are also provided for on the form. Does anyone have any comments for this form? 4 5 (NO RESPONSE.) MS. FORRESTER: Let the record show that we 6 have received no comments and no one has raised 7 their hand. 8 9 MR. KELLER: Okay. We will go to the next 10 form, which is The Statement of Gross Income, DR501A. And this form is being adjusted to allow 11 12 for the "under penalties of perjuries statement" that provides for it to be sworn to or made under 13 14 oath and the statute for that is Section 196.101(4)(c) -- 196.101(4)(c) Florida Statutes. 15 16 Does anyone have comments on this form? 17 (NO RESPONSE.) 18 MS. FORRESTER: All right. We will let the 19 record show that we have received no comments and no hands have been raised. 20 21 MR. KELLER: Okay. The last form is 22 Designation of Ownership Shares of Abandoned Homestead, Form DR501TS. And this is a form that 23 24 is required to be sworn to by Sections 25 193.155(8)(f) -- that's 193.155(8)(f), Florida

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10 statutes. This form is being adjusted to allow 1 2 for the "under penalties of perjury" statement in 3 lieu of the notarization, which is on the current form. Does anyone have comments on this form? 4 5 (NO RESPONSE.) MS. FORRESTER: Okay. We will let the record 6 show that we still have not received any comments 7 and no hands have been raised. 8 9 MR. KELLER: Okay. Thank you. Now, lastly, we will talk about the rule, which is 12D-16.002. 10 11 And this rule serves to function -- to adopt these 12 forms once the rule is amended and incorporate the forms by reference and with a revision date that 13 14 will become effective when the rule becomes effective. 15 16 Does anyone have any comments on this rule, 12D-16.002? 17 18 (NO RESPONSE.) 19 MS. FORRESTER: Okay. Let the record show that we have received no comments and no hands 20 21 have been raised. 22 MR. KELLER: Well, very well, thank you. And 23 I will turn it back over to the moderator at this 24 time. 25 MS. FORRESTER: Thank you, Mr. Keller. On

behalf of the Department, I want to thank everyone  $\overset{11}{\phantom{0}}$ 1 2 for participating. Your participation is very helpful during the rule promulgation process. 3 You may provide written comments to us. 4 5 Please bear in mind that they do become part of 6 the public record.
