At their September 21, 2021, public meeting, the Governor and Cabinet approved adoption and certification of the Department of Revenue's proposed property tax rules. The proposed rules include:

Notices of Change for Rule Chapter 12-9 and Rule 12D-16.002, Form DR-4001, were published in the F.A.R. on March 18, 2021 (Vol. 47, No. 53, pp. 1401-1405).

A Notice of Change for Rules 12-9.001, 12-9.002, 12-9.0031 and 12-9.007, was published in the F.A.R. on June 8, 2021 (Vol. 47, No. 110, pp. 2623-2624).

A Notice of Change for Rule 12-9.0031 was published in the F.A.R. on June 16, 2021 (Vol. 47, No. 116, p. 2774).

The Department reviewed the proposed rules listed above and determined that the proposed rules likely will not adversely impact small businesses, small counties, or small cities, and they are not likely to have an increased regulatory cost greater than \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rules. No Statement of Estimated Regulatory Cost is required for the proposed rules. The rules do not require ratification by the Florida Legislature under section 120.541(3), F.S.

The Department requests that the Committee file its certificate with the Bureau of Administrative Code on October 5, 2021. The Department would like to file the proposed rule for final adoption with the Department of State on October 5, 2021, for an effective date of October 25, 2021.
