Gas and Sulfur Production Tax Rates for 2021-2022

Producers of Gas and Sulfur

On July 1 of each year, the tax rates for production of gas and sulfur are adjusted as provided by law. The adjusted rates must be used when completing the *Declaration of Estimated Gas and Sulfur Production Tax* (Form DR-144ES) beginning with the July 2021 estimated payment. Form DR-144ES will be mailed to all active accounts during the last week of July.

Gas Production	
Tax Year	Tax Rate
Effective July 1, 2021	\$0.125 per MCF

Gas Production Tax Rate Calculation:

$$\begin{aligned} & \$0.171 \text{ (Base Rate)} \\ & \times 0.72831 \text{ (Base Rate Adjustment)} \\ & \hline & \$0.125 \text{ per MCF (1,000 cubic feet)} \end{aligned}$$

Sulfur Production	
Tax Year	Tax Rate
Effective July 1, 2021	\$4.78 per ton

Sulfur Production Tax Rate Calculation:

$$\begin{aligned} & \$2.43 \text{ (Base Rate)} \\ & \times 1.96713 \text{ (Base Rate Adjustment)} \\ & \hline & \$4.78 \text{ per ton} \end{aligned}$$

The rates are calculated based on the previous calendar year's producer price indices published by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics.
