Estate Tax Return Zero Filing Requirements Have Been Permanently Extended

The repeal of the requirement to file a *Florida Estate Tax Return* (Form F-706) has been permanently extended to apply to all estates of decedents who died on or after January 1, 2005.

No Florida estate tax is due for decedents who died on or after January 1, 2005.

For dates of death beginning January 1, 2005, if the estate **is not required** to file Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Form 706 or Form 706NA, the personal representative should use Florida Form DR-312, *Affidavit of No Florida Estate Tax Due*, to release the Florida estate tax lien.

For dates of death beginning January 1, 2005, if the estate **is required** to file Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Form 706 or Form 706NA, the personal representative should use Florida Form DR-313, *Affidavit of No Florida Estate Tax Due When Federal Return is Required*, to release the Florida estate tax lien.

Forms DR-312 and DR-313 are admissible as evidence of no liability for Florida estate tax and will remove the Department's estate tax lien. These forms must be filed with the clerk of the court in the county where the property is located. Please do not send these forms to the Department of Revenue.
