## **Exemption for Aviation Fuel Used by Certain Schools**

Beginning July 1, 2015, certain universities or colleges offering a graduate program in aeronautical or aerospace engineering, or flight training through a school of aeronautics or college of aviation, are exempt from aviation fuel tax. This exemption is limited to schools which:

- Are tax exempt organizations under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code,
- Are based in the state of Florida, and
- Are accredited by or have applied for accreditation by the Aviation Accreditation Board International.

The exemption is limited to purchases of aviation fuel used exclusively for flight training. Flight training includes instruction on building, repairing, or maintaining aircraft engines or flying an aircraft. Licensed terminal suppliers or wholesalers can receive an ultimate vendor credit on their return for the 6.9 cents per gallon of aviation fuel tax sold to qualified universities or colleges for use in flight training.

Terminal suppliers and wholesalers shall collect a certificate from the purchaser certifying that they meet the qualifications. A suggested format of a certificate is provided below.

Qualified universities and colleges may seek a refund for fuel taxes paid on aviation fuel used in flight training which was purchased from retail dealers, including fixed-based operators, by filing Form DR-26, Application for Refund with the Department. Universities and colleges must provide proof of qualification and submit purchase invoices showing fuel taxes were paid, a list of qualified equipment that the fuel was used in, fueling reports detailing the consumption of fuel, and tail wing numbers of aircraft.
