## 2020 Legislative Changes Regarding Electronic Filing and Payment of Reemployment Tax

Effective July 1, 2020, employers who are obligated to file reports electronically will also be required to file any corrections to those reports electronically. Employers who employed 10 or more employees in any quarter during the preceding state fiscal year (July 1 – June 30) are required to report and pay electronically. The Florida Department of Revenue's website explains the process of electronically filing corrections to reports. Also, effective July 1, 2020:

- the penalty for not paying by approved electronic means will be decreased from \$50 to \$25.
- the penalty for not filing by approved electronic means will be decreased from \$50 plus \$1 for every employee to \$25 plus \$1 for every employee, capping the imposed penalty at \$300.
- employers may make requests for a waiver of penalty by telephone.
- agents will not be required to file reports electronically for their clients. If, however, their client is required to file electronically, the client will receive a bill if the agent files the report other than by approved electronic means.
