

Use Company Identifiers to Prevent Debit Blocking

A debit block is a form of fraud prevention that protects your bank accounts from unauthorized electronic charges. If you have established a debit block with your financial institution on the bank account you are using to remit a tax or fee payment, you must communicate with your bank to authorize debit payments to the Florida Department of Revenue.

To ensure your debit payments to the Florida Department of Revenue are successful, you or your financial officer should:

- 1. Speak with your bank **before** setting up a debit payment.
- 2. Provide the company identifier (company ID), from the chart below, to your financial institution for the tax or fee you are paying.

Note: If you don't provide the company ID, your bank will reject the payment and the Florida Department of Revenue will send you a bill for the amount due which may include penalty and interest. You will also be assessed a returned item fee.
