SALES AND USE TAX

Sales and Use Tax collections were below the estimate in January 2020 by \$21.4m (-0.7%) and above the January 2019 collections by \$257.1m (8.7%). The estimates are based on the January 15, 2020 General Revenue Estimating Conference (GR) (page 3).


CORPORATE INCOME TAX


CIT collections of \$107.9m in January 2020 were above the estimate by \$15.9m (17.3%) and under the January 2019 collections by \$23.3m (-17.8%). The estimates are based on the January 15, 2020 GR conference (page 4).

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections of \$258.3m were greater than the estimate in January 2020 by \$28.9m (12.6%) and above the January 2019 collections by \$34.7m (15.5%). The estimates are based on the January 15, 2020 GR conference (page 5).


SALES TAX ...

... COLLECTIONS IN January 2020 of \$3,227.8m were \$-21.4m (-0.7%) below the estimate. The January 2020 Sales and Use Tax collections were \$257.1m (8.7%) above the January 2019 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on the January 15, 2020 GR conference.

Analysis of December collections by category...

Five categories were above the estimates in December 2018, with Construction (15.8%) above, Auto-Related (5.7%) above, Consumer Non-Durables (3.1%) above, Tourism & Rec. (1.4%) above, and Other Consumer Durables (0.1%) above. Business Investment was (-1.1%) below. Compared to December 2017, five categories were above the same month collections last year, Construction being the strongest at 14.1% above, while Other Consumer Durables was the weakest at (-2%).The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR.

Note: December 2020 sales tax collections by categories reflect November 2020 activity.






CORPORATE INCOME TAX....

... COLLECTIONS of \$107.9m in January 2020 were above the estimate by \$15.9m (17.3%) and under the January 2019 collections by \$23.3m (-17.8%). The estimates are based on the January 15, 2020 GR conference (page 4).








OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax, other taxes contributed \$871.5m to DOR tax collections in January 2020, which were \$39.3m (4.7%) above the estimate. The January 2020 collections were \$46m (5.6%) above the same month previous year's collections. The Doc Stamp Collections in January 2020 were \$28.9m (12.6%) above the estimate. Compared to January 2019 collections on Doc Stamp Taxes, the January 2020 collections were \$34.7m (15.5%) above.

The collections of the Communications Services Tax in January were above the estimate by \$0.1m (0.1%). Compared to January 2019 collections on Communication Services Tax, the January 2020 collections were \$3.2m (-2.3%) below. The collections of Insurance Premium Tax in January were below the estimate by \$0.3m (-16.6%). Compared to January 2019 collections on Insurance Premium Taxes, the January 2020 collections were \$0.7m (99.2%) above. The collections of Fuel-related Taxes & Fees in January were above the estimate by \$2.2m (0.6%). The non-recurring Intangible Tax collections were \$9.7m (31.4%) above.







HISTORICAL COMPARISON GRAPHS	
Pages 7-16 contain graphs for individual tax sources comparing the current fiscal year's actual and projected collections and collections for the three most recent fiscal years. The upper panel on each page presents monthly collections. The lower panel compares actual and expected collections on a fiscal year basis. In the lower panel, the bars prefaced by 'ACT' depict actual collections through the current month of each respective year. The bar prefaced by 'EST' shows that cumulation of the current year's DOR estimate through the current month. DOR's estimates are derived from estimates produced by the REC in January 2020 . These estimates are adjusted to make them compatible with DOR's cash collection figures.
