SALES AND USE TAX

Sales and Use Tax collections were \$3,292.9m in May, and above the May 2020 collections by \$1416.5m (75.5%). Collections for Sales Tax include Local Option Sales Tax and 2.6% Gross Receipts. These receipts are from the perspective of department collections and do not reflect collections of other state entities.


CORPORATE INCOME TAX

CIT collections of \$271m in May 2021 were over the May 2020 collections by \$107.3m (65.6%). These receipts are from the perspective of department collections and do not reflect collections of other state entities.

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections of \$416m were above the May 2020 collections by \$224.1m (116.7%). These receipts are from the perspective of department collections and do not reflect collections of other state entities.





CORPORATE INCOME TAX....

... COLLECTIONS of \$271m in May 2021 were over the May 2020 collections by \$107.3m (65.6%).





OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax, other taxes contributed \$1068m to DOR tax collections in May 2021. The May 2021 collections were \$408.4m (61.9%) above the same month previous year's collections. The Doc Stamp Collections in May 2021 were \$416m. Compared to May 2020 collections on Doc Stamp Taxes, the May 2021 collections were \$224.1m (116.7%) above.

The May 2021 collections of the Communications Services Tax compared to May 2020 collections were \$2m (-1.5%) below. The collections of Insurance Premium Tax in May were 9m. Compared to May 2020 collections on Insurance Premium Taxes, the May 2021 collections were \$3.7m (99.3%) above. The collections of Fuel-related Taxes & Fees in May were above the prior year by \$162.7m (75.2%). The non-recurring Intangible Tax collections were \$24.4m (62.8%) above the prior year.
