SALES AND USE TAX

Sales and Use Tax collections were \$2,286.3m in June, and below the June 2019 collections by \$417.9m (-15.5%). Collections for Sales tax include Local Option Sales Tax and Gross Receipts. These receipts are from the perspective of department collections and do not reflect collections of other state entities.


CORPORATE INCOME TAX

CIT collections of \$417.4m in June 2020 were under the June 2019 collections by \$134.5m (-24.4%). These receipts are from the perspective of department collections and do not reflect collections of other state entities.

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections of \$231.4m were below the June 2019 collections by \$20.7m (-8.2%). These receipts are from the perspective of department collections and do not reflect collections of other state entities.





CORPORATE INCOME TAX....

... COLLECTIONS of \$417.4m in June 2020 were under the June 2019 collections by \$134.5m (-24.4%).





OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax, other taxes contributed \$980.7m to DOR tax collections in June 2020. The June 2020 collections were \$95.2m (-8.9%) below the same month previous year's collections. The Doc Stamp Collections in June 2020 were \$231.4m. Compared to June 2019 collections on Doc Stamp Taxes, the June 2020 collections were \$20.7m (-8.2%) below.

The June 2020 collections of the Communications Services Tax compared to June 2019 collections were \$2m (-1.5%) below. The collections of Insurance Premium Tax in June were \$222.8m. Compared to June 2019 collections on Insurance Premium Taxes, the June 2020 collections were \$10.1m (4.7%) above. The collections of Fuel-related Taxes & Fees in June were below the prior year by \$63.2m (-18%). The non-recurring Intangible Tax collections were \$10.7m (30.3%) above the prior year.
