SALES AND USE TAX

Sales and Use Tax collections were above the estimate in July 2019 by \$44.9m (1.7%) and above the July 2018 collections by \$154.9m (6%). The estimates are based on the March 14, 2019 General Revenue Estimating Conference (GR) (page 3).

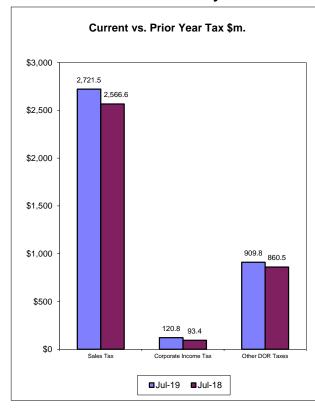
CORPORATE INCOME TAX

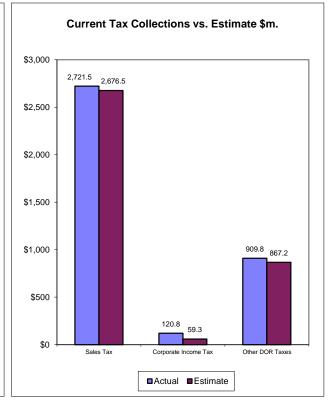
CIT collections of \$120.8m in July 2019 were above the estimate by \$61.5m (103.7%) and over the July 2018 collections by \$27.4m (29.3%). The estimates are based on the March 14, 2019 GR conference (page 4).

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections of \$291.1m were greater than the estimate in July 2019 by \$29.3m (11.2%) and above the July 2018 collections by \$38.4m (15.2%). The estimates are based on the March 14, 2019 GR conference (page 5).

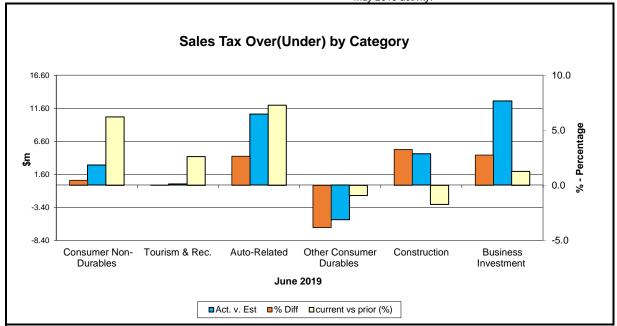
SALES TAX ...

... COLLECTIONS IN July 2019 of \$2,721.4m were \$44.9m (1.7%) above the estimate. The July 2019 Sales and Use Tax collections were \$154.9m (6%) above the July 2018 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on the March 14, 2019 GR conference.

Analysis of June collections by category...

Five categories were above the estimates in June 2019, with Construction (3.3%) above, Business Investment (2.8%) above, Auto-Related (2.7%) above, Consumer Non-Durables (0.5%) above, and Tourism & Rec. (0%) above. Other Consumer Durables was (-3.8%) below. Compared to June 2018, four categories were above the same month collections last year, Auto-Related being the strongest at 7.3% above, while Construction was the weakest at (-1.7%). The estimates are based on the March 14, 2019 GR.

Note: June 2019 sales tax collections by categories reflect May 2019 activity.

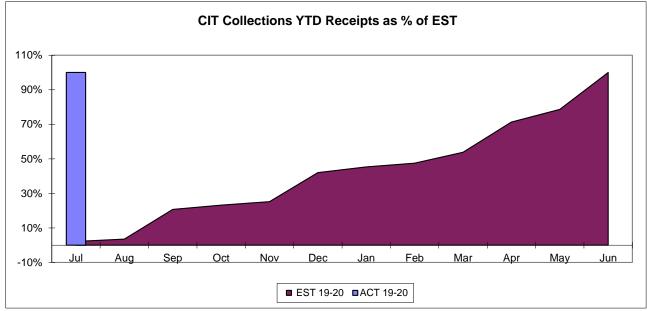


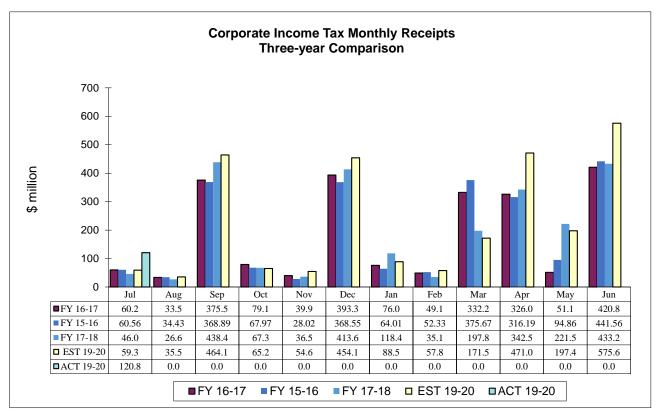

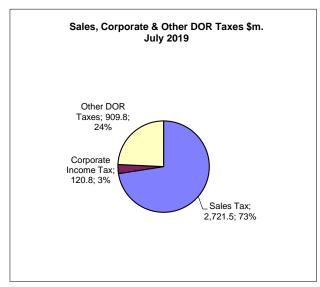


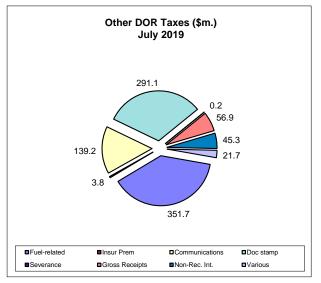


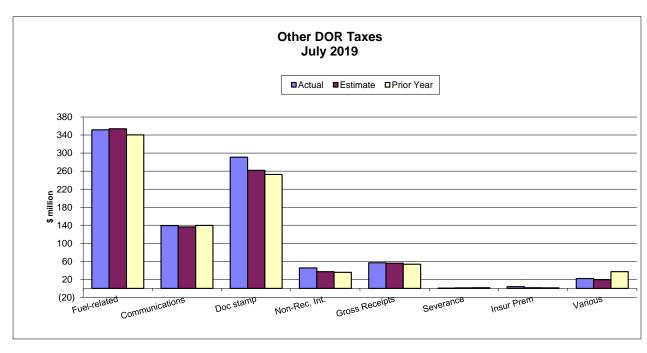
OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax, other taxes contributed \$909.8m to DOR tax collections in July 2019, which were \$42.6m (4.9%) above the estimate. The July 2019 collections were \$49.3m (5.7%) above the same month previous year's collections. The Doc Stamp Collections in July 2019 were \$29.3m (11.2%) above the estimate. Compared to July 2018 collections on Doc Stamp Taxes, the July 2019 collections were \$38.4m (15.2%) above

The collections of the Communications Services Tax in July were above the estimate by \$2.9m (2.1%). Compared to July 2018 collections on Communication Services Tax, the July 2019 collections were \$0.2m (-0.1%) below. The collections of Insurance Premium Tax in July were above the estimate by \$2.3m (154.6%). Compared to July 2018 collections on Insurance Premium Taxes, the July 2019 collections were \$2.8m (281.7%) above. The collections of Fuel-related Taxes & Fees in July were below the estimate by \$2.4m (-0.7%). The non-recurring Intangible Tax collections were \$8.2m (22%) above.
