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#### **SALES AND USE TAX**

Sales and Use Tax collections were below the estimate in August 2019 by \$37.6m (-1.4%) and above the August 2018 collections by \$198.4m (8.1%). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 General Revenue Estimating Conference (GR) (page 3).


# **CORPORATE INCOME TAX**


CIT collections of \$71.2m in August 2019 were above the estimate by \$18.1m (34.2%) and over the August 2018 collections by \$10.4m (17.1%). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR conference (page 4).

### **DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX**

Documentary Stamp Tax collections of \$244.5m were greater than the estimate in August 2019 by \$26.3m (12.1%) and above the August 2018 collections by \$1.6m (0.7%). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR conference (page 5).

# SALES TAX ...


... COLLECTIONS IN August 2019 of \$2,644.6m were \$-37.6m (-1.4%) below the estimate. The August 2019 Sales and Use Tax collections were \$198.4m (8.1%) above the August 2018 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on

the August 14, 2019 GR conference.

#### Analysis of July collections by category...

Four categories were above the estimates in July 2019, with Other Consumer Durables (4.7%) above, Construction (4.7%) above, Auto-Related (4.1%) above, and Business Investment (0.8%) above. Consumer Non-Durables was (-2.7%) below, and Tourism & Rec. (-2%) below. Compared to July 2018, five categories were above the same month collections last year, Business Investment being the strongest at 5% above, while Other Consumer Durables was the weakest at (-0.2%).The estimates are based on the March 14, 2019 GR.

Note: July 2019 sales tax collections by categories reflect June 2019 activity.






... COLLECTIONS of \$71.2m in August 2019 were above the estimate by \$18.1m (34.2%) and over the August 2018 collections by \$10.4m (17.1%). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR conference (page 4).








# OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax, other taxes contributed \$857.8m to DOR tax collections in August 2019, which were \$25.9m (3.1%) above the estimate. The August 2019 collections were \$17.4m (2.1%) above the same month previous year's collections. The Doc Stamp Collections in August 2019 were \$26.3m (12.1%) above the estimate. Compared to August 2018 collections on Doc Stamp Taxes, the August 2019 collections were \$1.6m (0.7%) above.

The collections of the Communications Services Tax in August were below the estimate by \$3.7m (-2.7%). Compared to August 2018 collections on Communication Services Tax, the August 2019 collections were \$7.6m (-5.4%) below. The collections of Insurance Premium Tax in August were below the estimate by \$1.7m (-85.4%). Compared to August 2018 collections on Insurance Premium Taxes, the August 2019 collections were \$2.1m (-87.8%) below. The collections of Fuel-related Taxes & Fees in August were below the estimate by \$5.6m (-1.5%). The non-recurring Intangible Tax collections were \$7.4m (23.8%) above.
