SALES AND USE TAX

Sales and Use Tax collections were above the estimate in October 2019 by \$11.5m (0.5%) and above the October 2018 collections by \$124m (5.1%). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 General Revenue Estimating Conference (GR) (page 3).


CORPORATE INCOME TAX


CIT collections of \$114.2m in October 2019 were above the estimate by \$51.2m (81.2%) and under the October 2018 collections by \$24.3m (-17.6%). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR conference (page 4).

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections of \$264.6m were greater than the estimate in October 2019 by \$15.6m (6.3%) and above the October 2018 collections by \$26.5m (11.1%). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR conference (page 5).


SALES TAX ...

... COLLECTIONS IN October 2019 of \$2,536.4m were \$11.5m (0.5%) above the estimate. The October 2019 Sales and Use Tax collections were \$124m (5.1%) above the October 2018 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR conference.

Analysis of September collections by category...

Three categories were above the estimates in September 2019, with Consumer Non-Durables (3.2%) above, Other Consumer Durables (3%) above, and Business Investment (0.8%) above. Tourism & Rec. was (-1.9%) below, Auto-Related (-1.5%) below, and Construction (-1.1%) below. Compared to September 2018, four categories were above the same month collections last year, Business Investment being the strongest at 5.5% above, while Other Consumer Durables was the weakest at (-3.8%).The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR.

Note: September 2019 sales tax collections by categories reflect August 2019 activity.













OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax, other taxes contributed \$1052.7m to DOR tax collections in October 2019, which were \$1.9m (-0.2%) below the estimate. The October 2019 collections were \$54.9m (5.5%) above the same month previous year's collections. The Doc Stamp Collections in October 2019 were \$15.6m (6.3%) above the estimate. Compared to October 2018 collections on Doc Stamp Taxes, the October 2019 collections were \$26.5m (11.1%) above.

The collections of the Communications Services Tax in October were below the estimate by \$7m (-5.1%). Compared to October 2018 collections on Communication Services Tax, the October 2019 collections were \$6.9m (-5%) below. The collections of Insurance Premium Tax in October were below the estimate by \$5.3m (-2.5%). Compared to October 2018 collections on Insurance Premium Taxes, the October 2019 collections were \$23.2m (12.9%) above. The collections of Fuel-related Taxes & Fees in October were below the estimate by \$16.8m (-4.9%). The non-recurring Intangible Tax collections were \$11m (30.8%) above.
