SALES AND USE TAX

Sales and Use Tax collections were above the estimate in November 2019 by \$63.5m (2.4%) and above the November 2018 collections by \$196.5m (8%). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 General Revenue Estimating Conference (GR) (page 3).

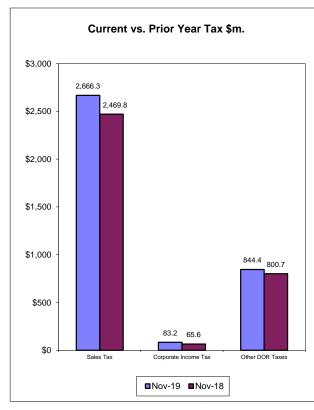
CORPORATE INCOME TAX

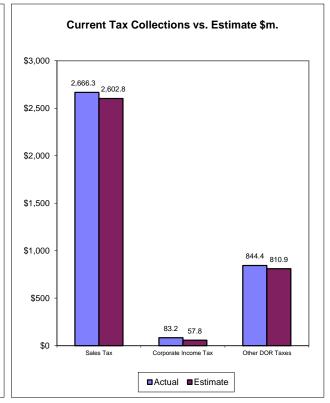
CIT collections of \$83.2m in November 2019 were above the estimate by \$25.4m (43.9%) and over the November 2018 collections by \$17.6m (26.9%). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR conference (page 4).

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections of \$219.6m were greater than the estimate in November 2019 by \$17.4m (8.6%) and above the November 2018 collections by \$22.1m (11.2%). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR conference (page 5).

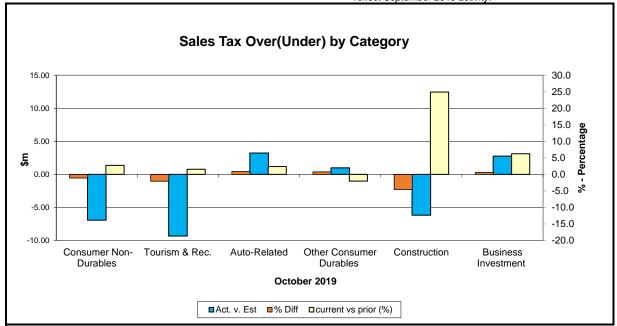
SALES TAX ...

... COLLECTIONS IN November 2019 of \$2,666.2m were \$63.5m (2.4%) above the estimate. The November 2019 Sales and Use Tax collections were \$196.5m (8%) above the November 2018 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR conference.

Analysis of October collections by category...

Three categories were above the estimates in October 2019, with Auto-Related (0.9%) above, Other Consumer Durables (0.8%) above, and Business Investment (0.6%) above. Construction was (-4.6%) below, Tourism & Rec. (-2.1%) below, and Consumer Non-Durables (-1.1%) below. Compared to October 2018, five categories were above the same month collections last year, Construction being the strongest at 24.9% above, while Other Consumer Durables was the weakest at (-2%).The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR.

Note: October 2019 sales tax collections by categories reflect September 2019 activity.

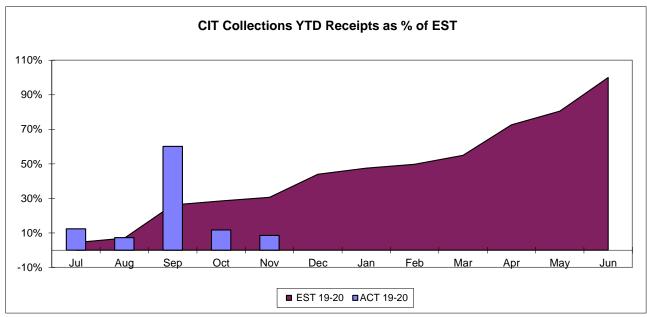


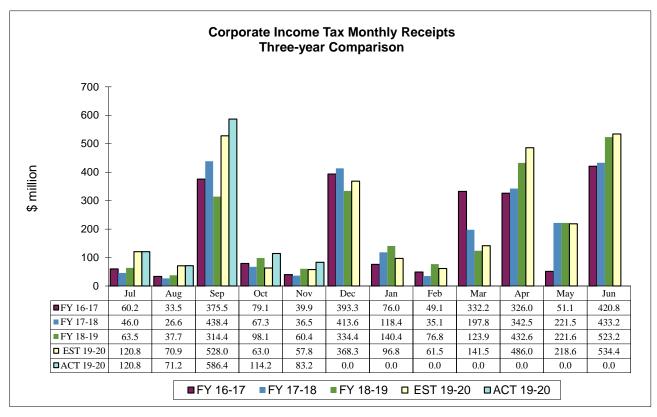

... COLLECTIONS of \$83.2m in November 2019 were above the estimate by \$25.4m (43.9%) and over the November 2018 collections by \$17.6m (26.9%). The estimates are based on the August 14, 2019 GR conference (page 4).

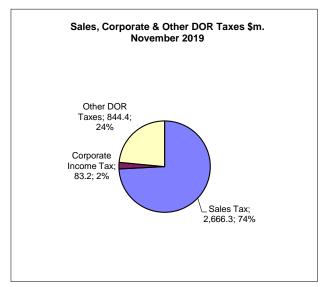


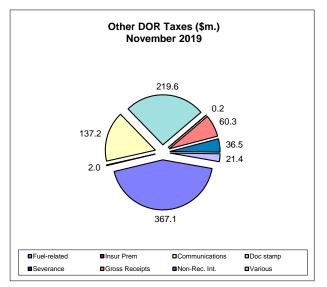


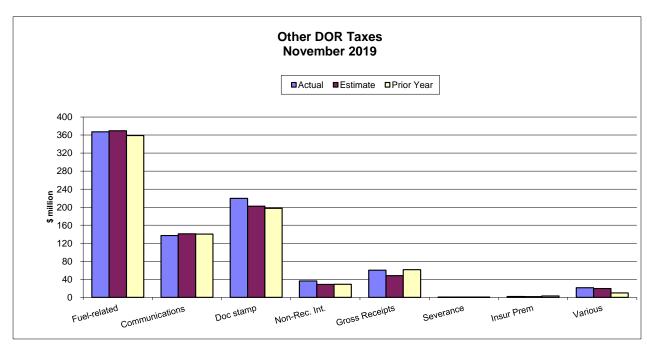
OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax, other taxes contributed \$844.4m to DOR tax collections in November 2019, which were \$33.6m (4.1%) above the estimate. The November 2019 collections were \$43.7m (5.5%) above the same month previous year's collections. The Doc Stamp Collections in November 2019 were \$17.4m (8.6%) above the estimate. Compared to November 2018 collections on Doc Stamp Taxes, the November 2019 collections were \$22.1m (11.2%) above.

The collections of the Communications Services Tax in November were below the estimate by \$3.9m (-2.7%). Compared to November 2018 collections on Communication Services Tax, the November 2019 collections were \$3.1m (-2.2%) below. The collections of Insurance Premium Tax in November were above the estimate by \$0.4m (25.7%). Compared to November 2018 collections on Insurance Premium Taxes, the November 2019 collections were \$1.2m (-37.8%) below. The collections of Fuel-related Taxes & Fees in November were below the estimate by \$2.4m (-0.6%). The non-recurring Intangible Tax collections were \$7.8m (27.1%) above.
