SALES AND USE TAX

Sales and Use Tax collections were above the estimate in January by \$68.4m (2.9%) and over the 2014 January collections by \$210.9m (9.6%). The estimates are based on the December 15, 2014 Revenue Estimating Conference (REC) (page 3).


CORPORATE INCOME TAX


CIT collections of \$76.0m in January were below the estimates by \$7.2m (8.7%) and above the 2014 January collections by \$4.8m (6.7%). The estimates are based on the December 15, 2014 REC conference (page 4).

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections were below the estimate by \$25.6m (14.5%) in January and above the 2014 January collections by \$1.5m (1.0%). The estimates are based on the December 15, 2014 REC conference (page 5).


SALES TAX ...

... COLLECTIONS IN January 2015 of \$2,415.6m were \$68.4m (2.9%) above the estimates. The January Sales and Use Tax collections were \$210.9m (9.6%) above the January 2014 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on the December 15, 2014 REC conference.

Analysis of December collections by category...

Two categories were above the estimates in December, Consumer Non-Durables (1.1%) and Auto-Related (1.2%). Four categories were below the estimates, Constructions being the weakest (2.2%) followed by Tourism (1.1%). Compared to December 2013, all six categories were above the same month collections last year, Constructions being the strongest (9.4%) followed by Other Consumer Durables (7.2%) and Tourism (7.0%).

Note: December 2014 sales tax collections by categories reflect November 2014 activity.






CORPORATE INCOME TAX....

.... Collections of \$76.0m were \$7.2m (8.7%) below the January estimates. The January 2015 CIT collections were \$4.8 million (6.7%) above the January 2014 CIT collections. The estimates are based on the December 15, 2014 REC conference.





OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax contributed \$726.4m to DOR tax collections in January 2015, which were \$10.9m (1.5%) below the estimates. The January collections were \$10.6m (1.5%) above the same month previous year's collections. Doc Stamps collections were \$25.6m (14.5%) below the estimates. The Doc Stamps collections in January were \$1.5m (1.0%) above the January 2014 collections. The non-recurring Intangible Tax in January was below the estimate by \$1.5m (6.5%). Compared to the January 2014's collections, the non-recurring Intangible Tax was 6.9% above.

The January collections on Fuel Related Taxes were \$4.9m (1.6%) above the estimates. Compared to January 2014 collections on Fuel Related Taxes, the January 2015 collections were \$13.0m (4.4%) above. The Communications Services Tax collections were \$4.6m (2.7%) above the estimates. The 2.5% Gross Receipt Utility Tax collections in January 2015 were \$4.1m (8.9%) above the estimates, and were 6.6% above the same month's collection in the prior year. Insurance Premium Tax collections were \$1.5m above the estimates in January 2015.
