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
CORPORATE INCOME TAX


CIT collections of \$76.8m in February 2018 were above the estimates by \$17.3m (29.0%) and above the February 2018 collections by \$41.7m (118.7%). The estimates are based on the February 9, 2018 GR conference (page 4).

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections of \$174.1m were below the estimate in February 2018 by \$9.3m (5.1%) and below the February 2017 collections by \$2.2m (1.3%). The estimates are based on the February 9, 2018 GR conference (page 5).


SALES TAX ...

... COLLECTIONS IN February 2018 of \$2,445.4m were \$26.8m (1.1%) above the estimate. The February 2018 Sales and Use Tax collections were \$167.6m (7.4%) above the February 2017 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on the February 9, 2018 GR conference.

Analysis of January collections by category...

Two categories were above the estimates in January 2018, with Tourism & Rec. 1.4% above and Auto-Related 5.0% above. The remaining categories of sales tax were below the estimate. Consumer Non-durables was 1.4% below, Other Consumer Durables 1.1% below, Construction 3.2% below and Business Investment 1.3% below the estimate. Compared to January 2017, all categories were above the same month collections last year. The estimates are based on the February 9, 2018 GR conference.

Note: January 2018 sales tax collections by categories reflect December 2017 activity.






CORPORATE INCOME TAX....

.... Collections of \$76.8m in February 2018 were \$17.3m (29.0%) above the February estimates. The February 2018 CIT collections were \$41.7m (118.7%) above the February 2018 CIT collections. The estimates are based on the February 9, 2018 GR conference.








OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax, other taxes contributed \$911.6m to DOR tax collections in February 2018, which were \$8.8m (1.0%) above the estimate. The February 2018 collections were \$55.4m (6.5%) above the same month previous year's collections. The Doc Stamp Collections in February 2018 were \$9.3m (5.1%) below the estimate. Compared to February 2017 collections on Doc Stamp Taxes, the February 2018 collections were \$2.3m (1.3%) below.

The collections of the Communications Services Tax in February were below the estimate by \$13.5m (8.5%). Compared to February 2017 collections on Communication Services Tax, the February 2018 collections were \$10.4m (7.7%) above. The collections of Insurance Premium Tax in February were above the estimate by \$25.7m (21.4%). Compared to February 2017 collections on Insurance Premium Taxes, the February 2018 collections were \$41.6m (39.9%) above. The collections of Fuel-related Taxes & Fees in February were above the estimate by \$1.6m (0.5%). The non-recurring Intangible Tax collections were \$3.2m (11.2%) below.







HISTORICAL COMPARISON GRAPHS	
Pages 7-16 contain graphs for individual tax sources comparing the current fiscal year's actual and projected collections and collections for the three most recent fiscal years. The upper panel on each page presents monthly collections. The lower panel compares actual and expected collections on a fiscal year basis. In the lower panel, the bars prefaced by 'ACT' depict actual collections through the current month of each respective year. The bar prefaced by 'EST' shows that cumulation of the current year's DOR estimate through the current month. DOR's estimates are derived from estimates produced by the REC in February 2018 . These estimates are adjusted to make them compatible with DOR's cash collection figures.
