SALES AND USE TAX

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Sales and Use Tax collections were above the estimate in April by \$36.5m (1.6%) and over the 2014 April collections by \$225.1m (10.4%). The estimates are based on the March 10, 2015 Revenue Estimating Conference (REC) (page 3).


CORPORATE INCOME TAX


CIT collections of \$326.0m in April were above the estimates by \$5.3m (1.7%) and below the 2014 April collections by \$15.6m (4.5%). The estimates are based on the March 10, 2015 REC conference (page 4).

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections were above the estimate by \$11.0m (6.1%) in April and above the 2014 April collections by \$21.4m (12.6%). The estimates are based on the March 10, 2015 REC conference (page 5).


SALES TAX ...

... COLLECTIONS IN April 2015 of \$2,398.0m were \$36.5m (1.6%) above the estimates. The April Sales and Use Tax collections were \$225.1m (10.4%) above the April 2014 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on the March 10, 2015 REC conference.

Analysis of March collections by category...

Two categories were above the estimates in March 2015, Tourism & Recreation (2.0%) and Auto-Related (0.5%). The other four categories were below the estimates, Construction being the weakest (8.1%) followed by Other Consumer Durables (4.9%). Compared to March 2014, all six categories were above the same month collections last year, Auto-Related being the strongest (8.9%) followed by Tourism (7.7%) and Other Consumer Durables (6.7%).

Note: March 2015 sales tax collections by categories reflect February 2015 activity.






CORPORATE INCOME TAX....

.... Collections of \$326.0m were \$5.3m (1.7%) above the April estimates. The April 2015 CIT collections were \$15.6 million (4.5%) below the April 2014 CIT collections. The estimates are based on the March 10, 2015 REC conference.





OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax contributed \$988.3m to DOR tax collections in April 2015, which were \$22.9m (2.4%) above the estimates. The April collections were \$44.2m (4.7%) above the same month previous year's collections. Doc Stamps collections were \$11.0m (6.1%) above the estimates. The Doc Stamps collections in April were \$21.4m (12.6%) above the April 2014 collections. The non-recurring Intangible Tax in April was above the estimate by \$2.3m (9.6%). Compared to the April 2014's collections, the non-recurring Intangible Tax was 31.0% above.

The April collections on Fuel Related Taxes were \$18.7m (5.8%) above the estimates. Compared to April 2014 collections on Fuel Related Taxes, the April 2015 collections were \$22.8m (7.2%) above. The Communications Services Tax collections were \$2.6m (1.5%) above the estimates. The 2.5% Gross Receipt Utility Tax collections in April 2015 were \$0.4m (0.9%) above the estimates, and were 9.4% below the same month's collection in the prior year. Insurance Premium Tax collections were \$14.8m (8.1%) below the estimates in April 2015.
