SALES AND USE TAX

Sales and Use Tax collections were above the estimate in May by \$16.0m (0.8%) and over the 2013 May collections by \$155.8m (8.4%). The estimates are based on the March 9, 2014 Revenue Estimating Conference (REC) (page 3).


CORPORATE INCOME TAX


CIT collections of \$40.5m in April were below the estimate by \$18.5m (31.3%) and below the 2013 May collections by \$8.6m (17.5%). The estimates are based on the March 9, 2014 REC conference (page 4).

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections were above the estimate by \$11.8m (7.8%) in May and above the 2013 May collections by \$2.8m (1.8%). The estimates are based on the March 9, 2014 REC conference (page 5).


SALES TAX ...

... COLLECTIONS IN May 2014 of \$2,002.4m were \$16.0m (0.8%) above the estimates. The May Sales and Use Tax collections were \$155.8m (8.4%) above the May 2013 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on the March 9, 2014 REC conference.

Analysis of April collections by category...

Collections of Business Investment were above the estimates in April, which is the only category above the estimate. The rest five categories were below the estimates, Construction being the weakest (5.1%) followed by Other Consumer Durables (3.6%). Compared to April 2013, all six categories were above the same month collections last year, Construction category being the strongest (12.7%) followed by Auto-Related (9.1%) and Business Investment(7.9%).

Note: April 2014 sales tax collections by categories reflect March 2014 activity.






CORPORATE INCOME TAX....

.... Collections of \$40.5m were \$18.5m (31.3%) below the May estimates. The May 2014 CIT collections were \$8.6 million (17.5%) below the May 2013 CIT collections. The estimates are based on the March 9, 2014 REC conference.





OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax contributed \$736.3m to DOR tax collections in May, which were \$8.8m (1.2%) above the estimates. The May collections were \$11.0m (1.5%) above the same month previous year's collections. Doc Stamps collections were \$11.8m (7.8%) above the estimates. The Doc Stamps collections in May were \$2.8m (1.8%) above May 2013 collections. The non-recurring Intangible taxes in May were \$0.7m (3.8%) above the estimates. Compared to the May 2013's collections, the non-recurring Intangible taxes were 19.2% below.

The May collections on Fuel Related Taxes were \$4.1m (1.4%) above the estimates. Compared to May 2013 collections on Fuel Related Taxes, the May 2014 collections were \$10.3m (3.5%) above. The Communications Services Tax collections were \$8.6m (4.7%) below the estimates. The Gross Receipt Utility collections in May 2014 were \$5.3m (12.3%) below the estimates, and were 11.5% below the same month's collection in the prior year. Insurance Premium tax collections were \$7.1m above the estimates in May 2014.
