SALES AND USE TAX


Sales and Use Tax collections were above the estimate in June 2017 by \$45.2m (1.95%) and over the 2016 June collections by \$190.7m (8.8%). The estimates are based on the March 17, 2017 General Revenue Estimating Conference (GR) (page 3).

CORPORATE INCOME TAX

CIT collections of \$433.2m in June 2017 were above the estimates by \$2.1m (0.5%) and below the 2016 June collections by \$8.3m (-1.88%). The estimates are based on the March 17, 2017 GR conference (page 4).

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections of \$225m were below the estimate in June 2017 by \$1.7m (-0.8%) and below the 2016 June collections by \$11.5m (-4.86%). The estimates are based on the March 17, 2017 GR conference (page 5).


SALES TAX ...

... COLLECTIONS IN June 2017 of \$2,358.3m were \$45.2m (1.95%) above the estimates. The June 2017 Sales and Use Tax collections were \$190.7m (8.8%) above the June 2016 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The 2016-17 fiscal year's collections were \$1,467.6m above the 2015-16 fiscal year's collections in sales tax. The estimates are based on the March 17, 2017 REC conference.Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on the March 17, 2017 REC conference.

Analysis of May collections by category...

Five categories were below the estimates in May 2017, Other Consumer Durables being the weakest at (-3.5%) followed by Auto-Related Sales and Construction at (-3.3%). Tourism and Rec. was above the estimate at (-0.3%). Compared to May 2016, all six categories were above the same month collections last year, Tourism & Rec. being the strongest (8.7%) followed by Consumer Non-Durables (4.4%) and Construction (3.4%)




CORPORATE INCOME TAX....


.... Collections of \$433.2m in June 2017 were \$2.1m (0.5%) above the June estimates. The June 2017 CIT collections were \$8.3m (-1.88%) below the June 2016 CIT collections. The 2016-17 fiscal year's collections were \$104.8m (4.6%) above FY 2015-16. The estimates are based on the March 17, 2017 REC conference.



OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax contributed \$1,011.4m to DOR tax collections in June 2017, which were \$9.6m (-0.9%) below the estimates. The June 2017 collections were \$0.4m (0.04%) above the same month previous year's collections. The Doc Stamp Collections in June 2017 were \$1.7m (-0.8%) below the estimates. The collections of the nonrecurring Intangible Tax in June were below the estimate by \$0.9m (-2.8%). Compared to the June 2016's collections, the non-recurring Intangible Tax collections were \$2.6m (-7.5%) below. The June collections of \$352.2m on Fuel Related Taxes were \$16.8m (-4.6%) below the estimates. Compared to June 2016 collections on Fuel Related Taxes, the June 2017 collections were \$1.5m (0.43%) Above. The Communications Services Tax collections were \$4.7m (3.5%) above the estimates. The 2.5% Gross Receipt Utility Tax collections in June 2017 were \$2.1m (4.3%) above the estimates, and were 6.59% above the same month's collection in the prior year. Insurance Premium Tax collections were \$2.3m (1.3%) above the estimates in June 2017.





HISTORICAL COMPARISON GRAPHS

Pages 7-16 contain graphs for individual tax sources comparing the current fiscal year's actual and projected collections and collections for the three most recent fiscal years. The upper panel on each page presents monthly collections. The lower panel compares actual and expected collections on a fiscal year basis. In the lower panel, the bars prefaced by 'ACT' depict actual collections through the current month of each respective year. The bar prefaced by 'EST' shows that cumulation of the current year's DOR estimate through the current month. DOR's estimates are derived from estimates produced by the REC in <u>March 2017</u>. These estimates are adjusted to make them compatible with DOR's cash collection figures.
