SALES AND USE TAX

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Sales and Use Tax collections were above the estimate in July by \$39.9m (2.0%) and over the 2013 July collections by \$137.9m (7.4%). The estimates are based on the March 9, 2014 Revenue Estimating Conference (REC) (page 3).


CORPORATE INCOME TAX


CIT collections of \$60.2m in July were below the estimate by \$2.8m (4.4%) and above the 2013 July collections by \$0.8m (1.4%). The estimates are based on the March 9, 2014 REC conference (page 4).

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections were above the estimate by \$3.7m (2.0%) in July and above the 2013 July collections by \$10.3m (5.7%). The estimates are based on the March 9, 2014 REC conference (page 5).


SALES TAX ...

... COLLECTIONS IN July 2014 of \$1,987.3m were \$39.9m (2.0%) above the estimates. The July Sales and Use Tax collections were \$137.9m (7.4%) above the July 2013 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on the March 9, 2014 REC conference and adjusted by themeasures from 2014 legislature session.

Analysis of June collections by category...

Collections of four categories were above the estimates in June, Business Investment was the strongest (5.5%) followed by Auto-Related category. Construction and Consumer Non-Durables were slightly below the estimates. Compared to June 2013, all six categories were above the same month collections last year, Auto-Related category being the strongest (12.1%) followed by Construction (10.6%) and Tourism & Recreation category (8.9%).

Note: June 2014 sales tax collections by categories reflect May 2014 activity.






CORPORATE INCOME TAX....

.... Collections of \$60.2m were \$2.8m (4.4%) below the July estimates. The July 2014 CIT collections were \$0.8 million (1.4%) above the July 2013 CIT collections. The estimates are based on the March 9, 2014 REC conference.





OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax contributed \$754.4m to DOR tax collections in July, which were \$2.0m (0.3%) below the estimates. The July collections were \$5.8m (0.8%) below the same month previous year's collections. Doc Stamps collections were \$3.7m (2.0%) above the estimates. The Doc Stamps collections in July were \$10.3m (5.7%) above July 2013 collections. The non-recurring Intangible taxes in July were \$1.4m (5.5%) above the estimates. Compared to the July 2013's collections, the non-recurring Intangible taxes were 10.1% below.

The July collections on Fuel Related Taxes were \$4.3m (1.5%) above the estimates. Compared to July 2013 collections on Fuel Related Taxes, the July 2014 collections were \$10.7m (3.8%) above. The Communications Services Tax collections were \$11.0m (6.0%) below the estimates. The Gross Receipt Utility collections in July 2014 were \$1.0m (1.9%) above the estimates, and were 12.3% above the same month's collection in the prior year. Insurance Premium tax collections were \$0.9m below the estimates in July 2014.
