Sales and Use Tax collections were above the estimate in September by \$64.5m (3.5%) and over the 2013 September collections by \$141.6m (8.0%). The estimates are based on the August 7, 2014 Revenue Estimating Conference (REC) (page 3).


CORPORATE INCOME TAX


CIT collections of \$375.9m in September were above the estimate by \$18.5m (5.2%) and above the 2013 September collections by \$30.7m (8.9%). The estimates are based on the August 7, 2014 REC conference (page 4).

DOCUMENTARY STAMP TAX

Documentary Stamp Tax collections were above the estimate by \$18.1m (10.8%) in September and above the 2013 September collections by \$40.2m (30.2%). The estimates are based on the August 7, 2014 REC conference (page 5).


SALES TAX ...

... COLLECTIONS IN September 2014 of \$1,905.0m were \$64.5m (3.5%) above the estimates. The September Sales and Use Tax collections were \$141.6m (8.0%) above the September 2013 Sales and Use Tax collections (see Graph on page 1). The estimates are based on the August 7, 2014 REC conference.

Analysis of August collections by category...

Three categories were above the estimates in August, Business Investment being the strongest (3.3%) followed by Other Consumer Durables (1.1%) and Consumer Non-Durables (0.3%). Three categories were below the estimates, Construction being the weakest (2.2%). Compared to August 2013, all six categories were above the same month collections last year, Auto-Related being the strongest (9.3%) followed by Constructions (9.2%) and Other Consumer Durables (9.1%).

Note: August 2014 sales tax collections by categories reflect July 2014 activity.






CORPORATE INCOME TAX....

.... Collections of \$375.9m were \$18.5m (5.2%) above the September estimates. The September 2014 CIT collections were \$30.7 million (8.9%) above the September 2013 CIT collections. The estimates are based on the August 7, 2014 REC conference.





OTHER DOR TAXES...

...excluding Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax contributed \$772.4m to DOR tax collections in September, which were \$17.1m (2.3%) above the estimates. The September collections were \$56.7m (7.9%) above the same month previous year's collections. Doc Stamps collections were \$18.7m (10.8%) above the estimates. The Doc Stamps collections in September were \$40.2m (30.2%) above the September 2013 collections. The non-recurring Intangible taxes in September were \$0.7m (2.9%) above the estimates. Compared to the September 2013's collections, the non-recurring Intangible taxes were 11.4% below.

The September collections on Fuel Related Taxes were \$1.6m (0.5%) below the estimates. Compared to September 2013 collections on Fuel Related Taxes, the September 2014 collections were \$5.7m (2.0%) above. The Communications Services Tax collections were \$2.3m (1.3%) below the estimates. The 2.5% Gross Receipt Utility Tax collections in September 2014 were \$2.4m (4.0%) below the estimates, and were 5.1% above the same month's collection in the prior year. Insurance Premium tax collections were \$2.9m above the estimates in September 2014.
